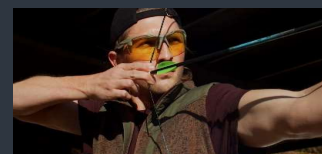

Changes to the MWFA Membership Fee Structure

A new fee structure was supported at the 2022 Annual General Meeting.

The existing fee structure was amended to encourage increased participation in monthly events. The new fee structure is as follows:

Adult: \$140

Family of 2 adults and all children: \$280

Juniors/Cubs (under 18): \$45

Monthly 3D shoot event (3 rd Sunday):

Financial Members: No Shoot Fee

Non-Members & Visitors: \$30 Shoot Fee

Lunch: \$5 lunch tokens can be purchased and redeemed for sausage & drink at any 3D Shoot

All members need to join and maintain membership of the Australian Bowhunters Association (ABA) for insurance purposes.

Membership funds are spent on maintaining the Club premises, targets and social events. Members are encouraged to contribute their time at working bees to help maintain the grounds.

An hour or so of your time can make a huge difference to what can be achieved and how great our Club is!

Members who assist at working bees will receive an entry into a raffle for a \$500 gift voucher to an archery store or hunting safari of your choice, drawn at our Christmas Party Shoot.

The **Australian Bowhunters Association Inc.** evolved from its founding organisation, The Trophy Bowhunters of Australia, in the late 1970s following a merging of the political and practising wings of organised bowhunting in Australia.

Today, the Association is recognised as the national body representing bowhunters throughout Australia.

The Australian Bowhunters Association Inc. is also affiliated with the International Field Archery Association (IFAA).

It is through the organisation of the Association that bowhunting legislation is sponsored, competition ranges are standardised, and consistent rules of the games are established..
